



CBOCES High School Student Profile

- Students who are over aged and under-credited
- Students who have been habitually truant or have significant attendance issues in their traditional high school.
- Age usually ranges from 17-21
 - With member districts if there is a referral for a student under the age of 17, the student's case will be reviewed on a case by case basis. If the student is allowed to attend the student will be identified as receiving program delivery and will not be transferred to CBHS until they become 17 years old. (This situation will use a purchased slot.)
 - With non-member districts students must be at least 17 years old to attend.
- A student who is in his/her senior year, but has a deficit of credits that cannot be made up through their school district options and which would prevent graduation that year.
- Many students are classified as "homeless" or are experiencing a life event that impacts their living arrangements.
- Circumstances do not allow them to attend a traditional high school day...work, health reasons, child care, etc.
- Bored or disenfranchised with the traditional high school and just want to get their diploma and move on with their plans...college, military, etc.
- Some students are identified as Special Ed students with minor learning challenges. Since CBOCES High School is very much student directed, it is not a good placement for students who have significant learning challenges.
- Many students have or had issues with drug use.
- CBOCES High School is a competency based high school and requires students to be motivated to complete the identified requirements. If a student is not self-motivated and focused on completing high school, CBHS may not be a good fit for them. A two week assessment period may be used to determine if the school is a good fit for the student, especially if the student is under 17 years old.
